Age Group: Two's

Proposal:	Represent clouds of different shapes
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • White papers • Markers
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Language & Literacy (Listening & understanding, Speaking, Vocabulary) • Creative Expression Through the Art (Sensory Art Experience, Creative Movement, Imaginative & Creative Play, Appreciation of the Arts)
Tips:	Invite your child to go outside. Observe the clouds and find shapes in them. Invite your child to represent/draw the clouds she/he saw.

Proposal:	<p>Let's go to the kitchen and use a Rolling Pin</p> <p>Pour approximately 1 cup (500 ml) of dry ingredients into a re-sealable bag and seal.</p> <p>Leftover or stale crackers can be reused for this activity.</p> <p>Hold a rolling pin by the handles and roll back and forth over the bag</p>
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rolling pin • Zipper seal sandwich bags • Crackers or other foods that can be crushed
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Uses different materials to explore • Enjoys learning and is confident in their own abilities to make new discoveries. • Answer the adult's questions kitchen activity engages the senses in several ways: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • children see the crackers crumble • children hear the crackers crunch • children feel the rolling pin move • children taste the crackers at snack time
Tips:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cereal in the bottom of the cereal box may be too crumbly for your cereal bowl. • Use it for this activity, then sprinkle the crumbs over a casserole or add to homemade muffins.

Proposal:	Stone Tracing!
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Collect a stone or rock. (You can also collect more than one) • Trace around the stone various times, overlapping at times to create a picture • Draw some additional details to your tracings • Paint your creation to add some color
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Black pastel or thick black crayon • Paper • Paint (tempera or watercolor) • Water • Your favorite rock or stone
Milestones :	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physical Development (Hand-Eye coordination, fine motor skills) • Scientific Inquiry (Natural Science) • The Arts (Sensory Art Experience)
Tips:	Feel free to collect additional stones from the outside and trace different sizes. This will add a fun mathematical twist to the activity.
