

## Atelier Experiences

Age Group: Three's

Proposal:	Search for unfamiliar kitchen items and research what they are for? What are their names? How do you use them? For example, the measuring cup.
Materials:	Tools that you can find in the kitchen
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Builds confidence</li><li>• Encourages independence</li><li>• Shows increased eagerness and curiosity as a learner</li></ul>
Tips:	You can measure water and pour it into different glass cups to observe the difference between each measurement. Follow a recipe and compare using the measure cup.

Proposal:	Use paint to represent how you feel about being at home. Represent your favorite part of the day at home.
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Paper</li><li>• Watercolors</li><li>• Tempera paint</li><li>• Small or fine brushes</li></ul>
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Language &amp; Literacy (Listening &amp; understanding, Speaking, Vocabulary)</li><li>• Creative Expression Through the Art (Sensory Art Experience, Creative Movement, Imaginative &amp; Creative Play, Appreciation of the Arts)</li></ul>
Tips:	Ask them how they are feeling before they begin. Ask them what color makes them feel that emotion or what color they feel represents that emotion.

Proposal:	Create with Playdough!  Clay or Playdough can be shaped and molded, rolled and cut, and stamped and pressed. There are endless possibilities to create with these materials.  <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Invite your child to explore Playdough and encourage them to create the human figure (mom, dad, themselves, a friend, a loved one, etc.)</li><li>• You can do this activity with your child as much as you'd like. Take pictures of the different things they create.</li></ul>
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Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Clay or Playdough</li><li>• Items to create texture<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Keys</li><li>○ Hex nuts</li><li>○ Forks</li><li>○ Etc.</li></ul></li></ul>
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Approaches to Learning (Eagerness &amp; Curiosity)</li><li>• Mathematical Thinking (Patterns, Geometry)</li><li>• The Arts (Creative Expression through the Arts)</li></ul>
Tips:	Use mathematical vocabulary when creating with the Playdough: circles, shapes, triangles, sphere, round, first, second, counting, etc.
