

Experiences

Age Group: Two's

Proposal:	Create a circuit with tape!
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tape
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gross motor skills • Flexibility • Balance • Endurance
Tips:	Tape 10 lines of tape in a row on the floor. Invite your child to jump on each line. You can also invite your child to hop on each line

Proposal:	Invite your child to make home-made play dough. (Keep it refrigerated during the week in order to use it multiple days.) Go on a nature walk and collect flowers. Invite your child to make a representation of one of the flowers using clay/playdough/homemade dough.
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clay • Playdough • Homemade dough.
Milestones :	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gains meaning by asking questions and observation • Eye- hand coordination • Flexible hands and wrist. • Asks for help • Begins to combine the information received from the senses to change the interaction with the environment and material
Tips:	Before making the representation. Invite them to smell, touch, and discuss the features of the flowers.

Proposal:	Lock & Key - Not only does this experience entertain your little locksmith to be, it also develops many milestones with three different lock/ key combos
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 3 different types locks (color coded to match the key)
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hand-eye-coordination & dexterity • Problem Solving • Memory
Tips:	Consider purchasing different types of locks like (chain door locks, latches, and padlocks. Careful with very small pieces, children should always be supervised.

Proposal:	Sand Race! To set up this experience you need to put two sand containers on one side and two empty plastic bowls on the other side. Then draw a line for your child and yourself to walk. The idea is to scoop the sand onto a spoon and transfer it to the other side.
Materials:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sand • Containers • Spoon • Tape
Milestone	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Balance • Walking in straight line • Pouring • Transferring from container
Tips:	You can also make zig zag lines on the floor to make this game more exciting!

Proposal:	<p>Sign Language!</p> <p>Let's learn some words in sign language! Watch the video and learn a new language</p>
Materials:	Just your hands!
Milestones:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approaches to Learning (Curiosity & Persistence) • Language & Literacy (Emergent Reading) • Physical Development (Fine-Motor)
Tips:	Think of other words your child uses often and learn that signs for those words together.
